THE IMPACT OF A TIYARA SCHOLARSHIP

As more Tiyara scholars supported by you graduate and gain employment, we are overwhelmed by the impact of your generosity! As you read through the 2022 Annual Report, you will be struck by the legacy you continue to build with your compassion and benevolence.

Not only is your legacy elevating these scholars, but the ripple effects of their success also extend to their parents and siblings, and in time to their future nuclear families, with multi-generational impact.

As we increased scholarship commitments, Tiyara scholars made their presence felt in 43 institutions of higher learning across India, including some attended by multiple Tiyara scholars. We are grateful to our local partners in India for their diligent stewardship and for keeping us connected with the scholars.

By the end of 2022, a total of 129 scholarships were extended, 11 scholars graduated and 6 were employed, earning in annual wages, several times their annual scholarships.

In 2022, as in 2021, we succeeded in giving over 100% of your designated scholarship gifts to underserved young women and men. To accomplish this, we applied some of the operating fund gifts to increase scholarship disbursements by 46%. We will strive to maintain this trend by focusing our efforts on raising both scholarships and general operating gifts.

Your commitment and loyalty inspire and sustain Tiyara's work and mission every day.

Enjal graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and true to her goal of "becoming one of the best nurses", she is now working at a hospital in her home state, and earning over two and a half times her annual scholarship. She lost her mother unexpectedly due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



Prabhu

Now a Medical Lab Technician, Prabhu's annual earnings are almost 3 times his annual scholarship. Prabhu has overcome the tragic loss of his mother, who was murdered by his special needs father.



Ragul

Ragul earned a Bachelor's in Mechatronics Engineering and is now a Senior Executive in the Auto industry, making over five and a half times his annual scholarship, in annual wages. Ragul's father was murdered by his uncle. Ragul continues to set himself higher goals and strives to achieve them!



Tholkappian

After completing a diploma in Electrical & Electronics Engineering, Tholkappian is now a Painting Planner in the auto industry, and his annual wages are 9 times as much as his annual scholarship. Tholkappian's father was imprisoned after being implicated in a crime.

Arpana

Arpana's father died of COVID-19 due to a lack of oxygen. As the family reeled under the loss, a Tiyara scholarship enabled Arpana to complete the degree she was pursuing - a Bachelor's in Theology. Arpana now plans to also study Nursing, with the help of family friends.



Samuel

Samuel earned a B.A. in English.

Samuel's father died of COVID-19, plunging his family into a deep emotional and economic depression. With a Tiyara Scholarship, Samuel has now earned a B.A. and is continuing on to pursue a Bachelor's in Education and enhance his employability.

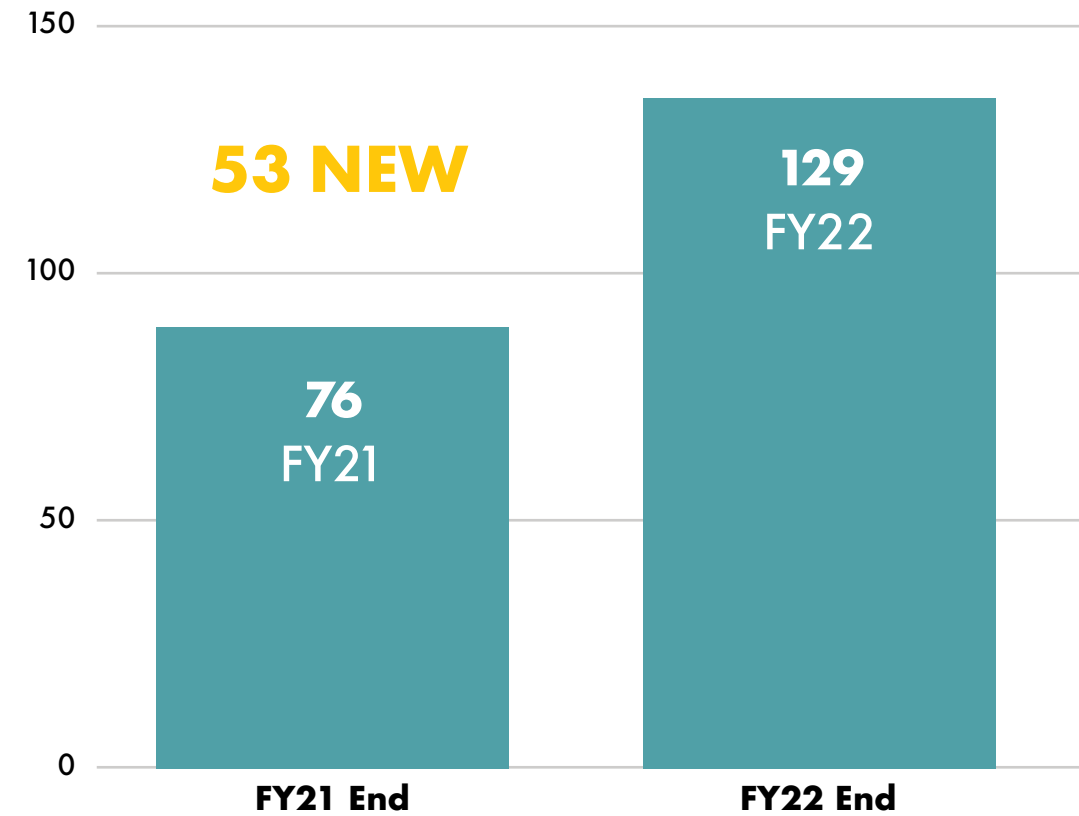
Sosang

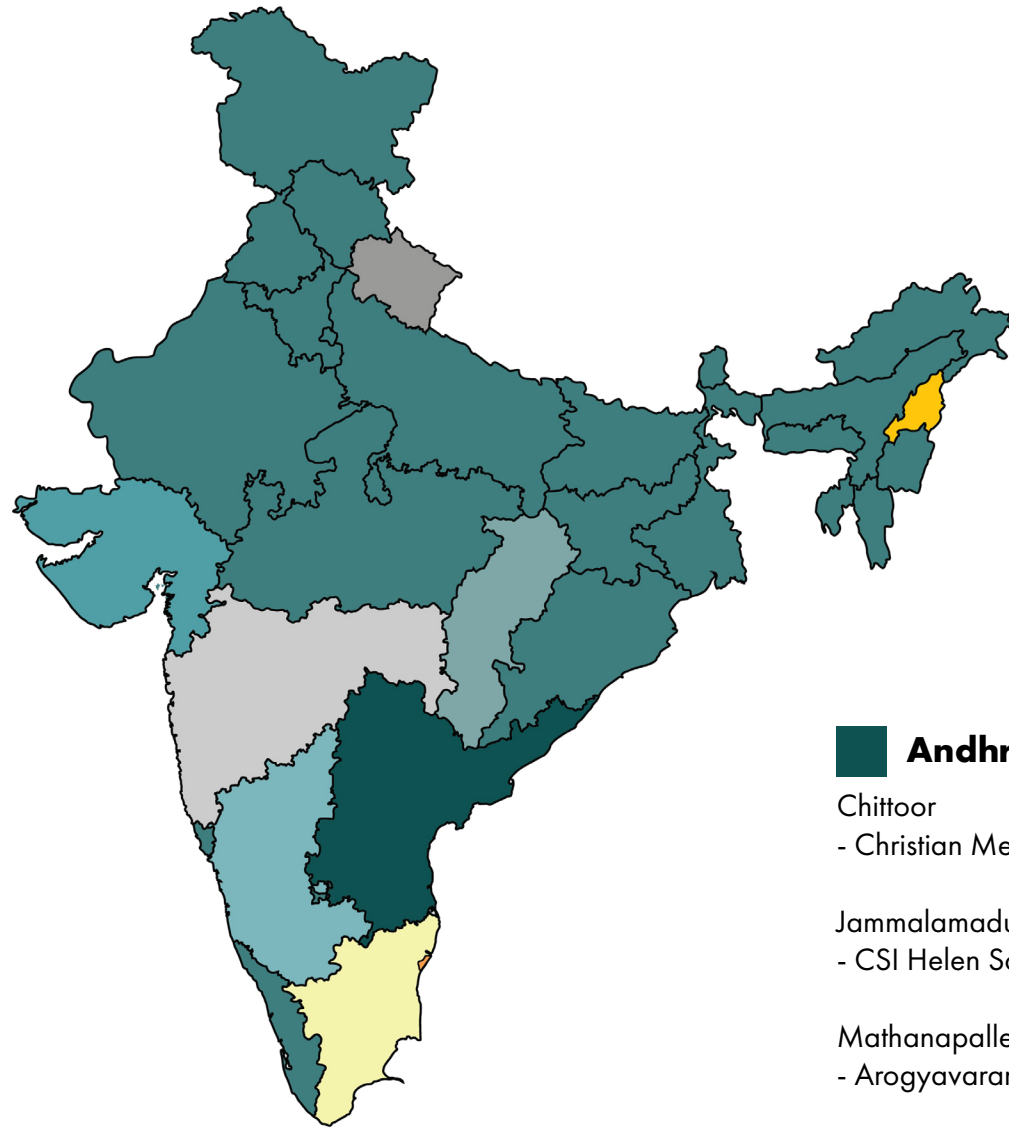

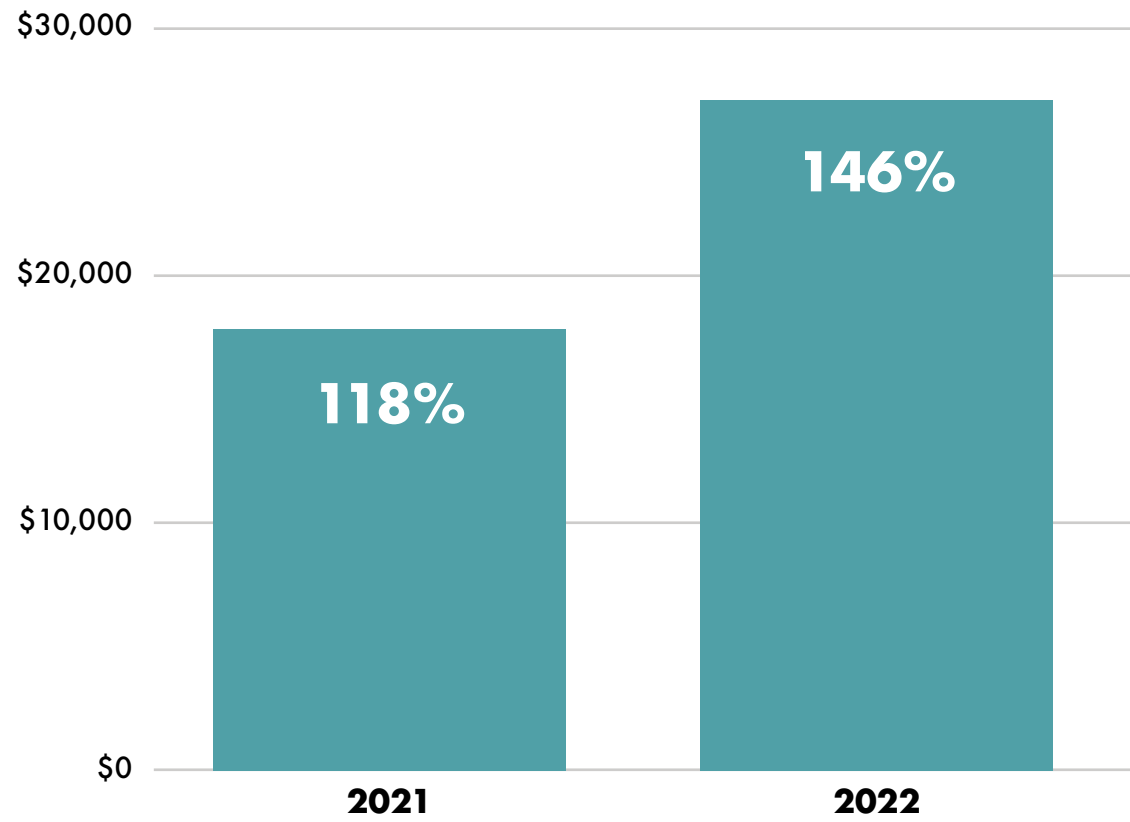

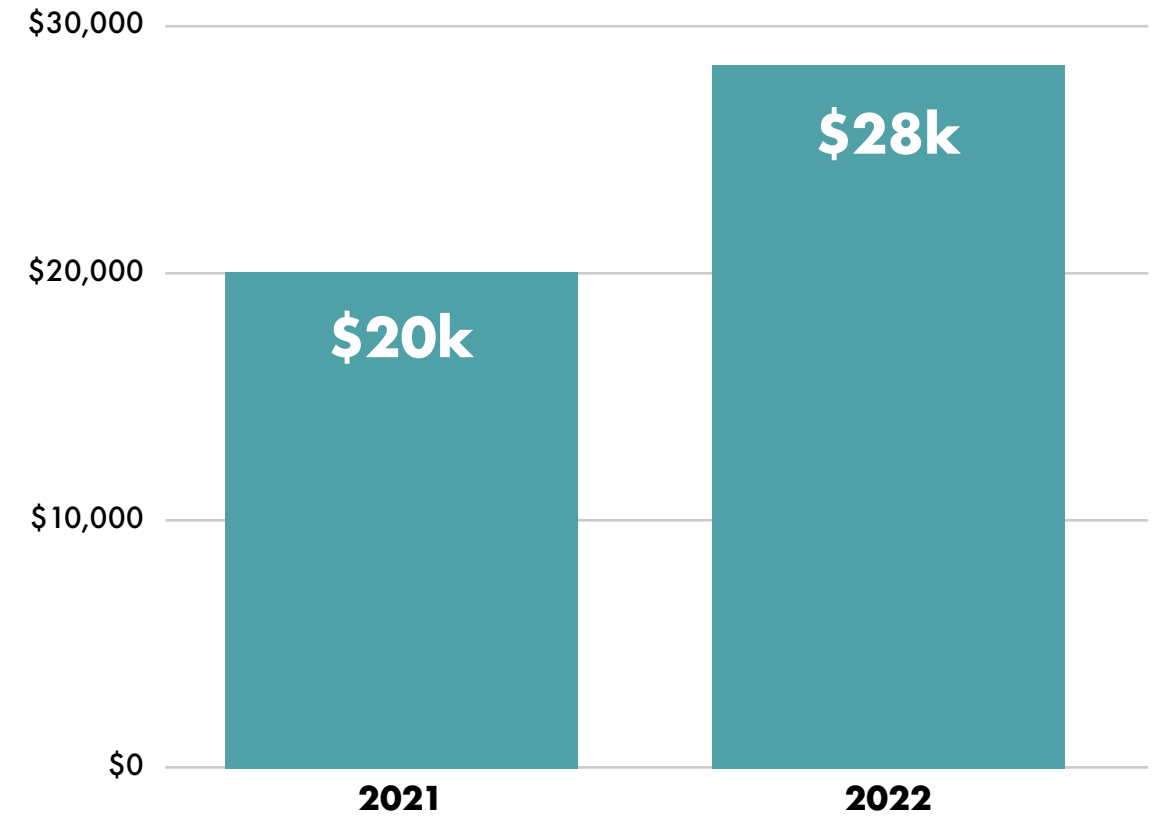
OUR SCHOLARSHIP SUPPORTERS MADE IT HAPPEN AGAIN!

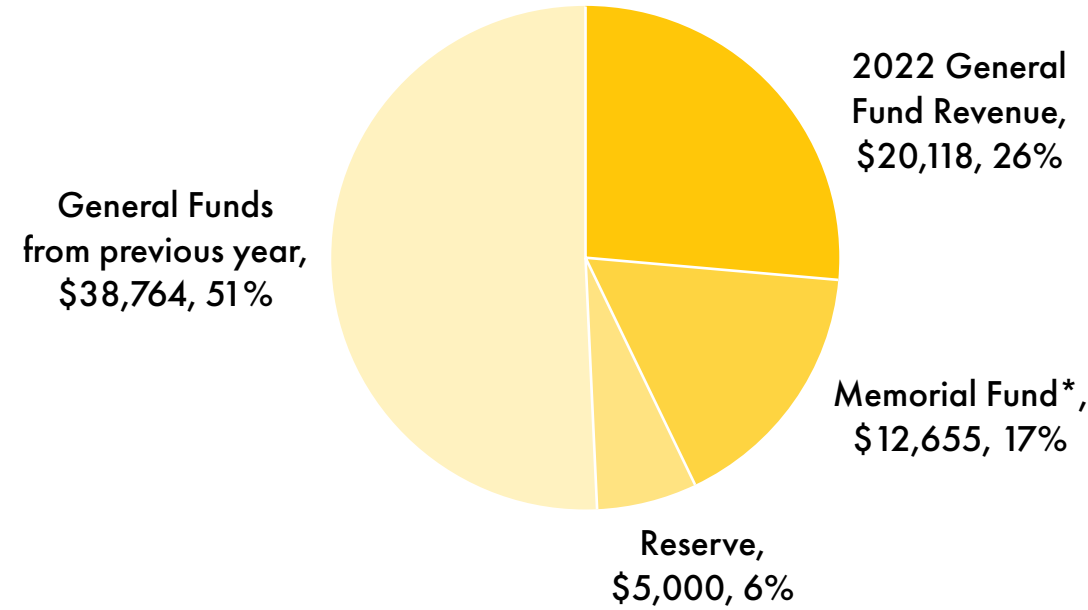

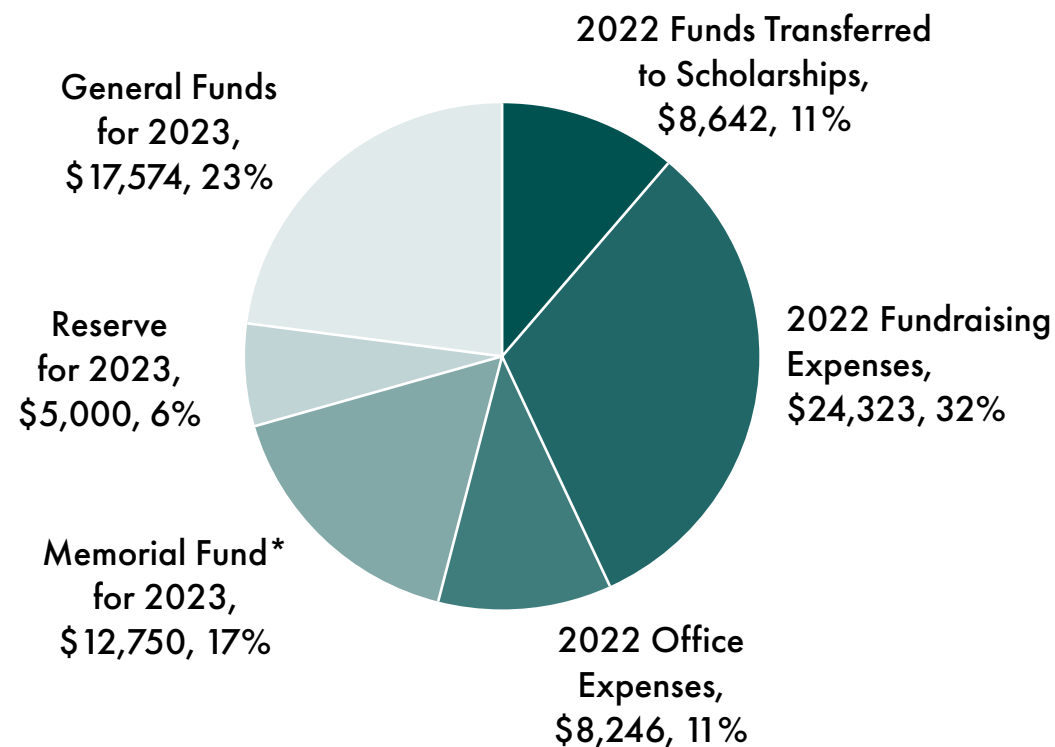


GENERAL OPERATIONS WERE FUNDED BY GENEROUS GIFTS TOWARDS OUR MISSION
